High Score FEI for each Division (AA. Open, Jr/YR.) (Does not include Freestyle, YH or Opportunity at any Level or division.) Check www.tndressage.com for final list.

National Dressage Pony Cup Award will be presented for scores earned in Saturday classes #281, 282, 284. PONY MEASUREMENT: Measurement of ponies will be conducted by appointment at the show. All expenses related to the measurement will be the responsibility of the owner of the pony or ponies up to \$100.00. Contact the Show Manager if you want to arrange to have a pony measured. Only measured ponies may participate in Pony Classes. Expenses may include vet travel time and trip fees. and any other expenses not normally associated with a dressage show.

The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) is offering ribbons and prizes to the high score (including a FEI high point) Thoroughbred at the CLASSIC show (Saturday Classes). Eligible horses must provide T.I.P. numbers to event organizer with entry. For more information, visit www.tjctip.com

Master's Classes: Register in the show office foe High Point Award. Open to entries in which the combined ages of Horse and Rider equal at least 65 yearson the date of the class. Riders are responsible for signing up in the show office. Award will be given for "Ole South Dressage Prelude" and "Ole South Dressage Classic."

ENTRIES: Entries accepted on a first come, first served basis. Management reserves the right to combine or divide classes, add or substitute judges or make any changes as required by circumstances. Riders who are not US citizens please include a copy of foreign competitor's license or USEF Card. **Each Entry** must have copies of All Required Documentation attached (If your horse is from out of state Health Cert. is required). Include LEGIBLE e-mail address and phone number on entry. Emailed entries will not be accepted. Acknowledgements of entry receipt and notification of problems with the entry will be emailed to the address that you provide. PLEASE READ AND RESPOND!

ENTRY FORMS: are available on <u>www.eqentries.com or www.TNdressage.com</u> or on the last page of this document.

CTDA Membership: Everyone who has an active (by opening date for Ole South) CTDA membership is eligible for 2 FREE bags of shavings. If for some reason entrant scratches entire show or does not check in for Ole South, the shavings will not be awarded.

Make check payable to CTDA, no entry will be processed or classes scheduled that have not included payment and mail with entry, USDF/USEF documents and copy of negative Coggins to Secretary. Entries must be received by the closing date. (Waive

signature requirements for receipt). Entries received after closing date will be placed on a waiting list.

Returned check policy: Void entry and incur a \$60 charge. Entries placed on a waiting list until a money order, certified check or cash is received. Management reserves the right to ask entries be paid by money order or certified check with the entry by any individual that has previously forfeited or bounced checks for any of the CTDA competitions.

ON LINE ENTRIES: www.EquestrianEntries.com is the website for online entries to this show. It is also the source for legible, "mistake proof" typed entries even if you do not choose to pay by credit card through them. Fees for online entries are 5% of entry. Or you can print the information and send with a check to the entry secretary. ENTRY DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-QUALIFYING RIDES:

- Current USEF membership (or n/m fees) for Rider, Owner and Trainer, Coach
- Current USDF membership (or n/m fees, number) for Rider and Owner. Rider's USDF membership may be either Participating or Group, Owner's USDF membership may be Participating, Group or Business; if Rider/Owner's USDF # is a non- member ID #, the USDF non-member fee must be paid.
- USDF Horse ID.
- Current negative Coggins and proof of vaccinations as per Rule GR845 (Link to USEF Rule GR845)

vaccinations: https://www.usef.org/documents/membership/EquineVaccinationRecord.pdf) or 30 day health certificate. (Current FEI Passport acceptable). All documentation must be legible and clearly state the name of the horse as entered in the show.

- For Adult Amateur classes USEF membership card must declare Amateur.
- Juniors and Young Riders must include birthdate.
- ➤ Freestyle entries copy of a 60% + at the highest test of the MFS level or higher.

FOR GAIG / USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES ALSO INCLUDE:

- > Check "Qualifying" where applicable and add \$15 per Qualifying class.
- > Copies of USEF and USDF Horse Registrations (not HID #s).
- ➤ Rider must have current Participating USDF membership; Owner must have current Participating or Business USDF membership.
- Rider and Owner, must have current USEF membership.

Freestyle: music must be given to the announcer at least four hours before the scheduled ride time. Coordinate a sound check time with the announcer. The required format for freestyle music is a CD. State level on Test of Choice classes.

ALL ENTRIES must have THREE SIGNATURES - Rider, Owner and Trainer. Legal Guardian must sign for riders under 18 yrs. Trainer blank must be signed by person over 18 who assumes responsibility for horse. (Parents who sign as trainer are exempt from membership requirements).

GUEST HORSE: Non Competing horses are welcome. Send a completed entry form with a \$35 guest horse fee plus the \$40 Office fee. Submit a current Coggins,(Proof of vaccination Rule GR845 applies to Guest Horses) with entry and pay either stabling or day parking. Competing horses will take preference over guest horses if warm up areas are crowded.

Refunds: Before closing date full refund, less office fee. No refunds after closing date, including cancellation of classes due to inclement weather.

STABLING: Permanent 10 X 10 stalls, with sliding doors. . Barns have wash racks, modern bathrooms/showers, vending areas. Pre Order extra shavings to have them available for your arrival. **For Groups: Specify ONE name to be assured of stabling together.**

TIMES: Official times available Thursday, noon at show office. Unofficial times posted before show at www.TNDressage.com. Entry acknowledgements will be emailed. Please include LEGIBLE email addresses and telephone number on entry form.

ARENAS: Air conditioned Indoor arena. Competition: 20 X 60 meters, two indoor, (side by side). Warm-up: One covered, and separate area for lunging. All outdoor rings are sand/quarter down mix. Indoor rings are clay/sand mix with coliseum seating. All arenas are open for schooling from Thursday noon until 8:00 pm. On Friday and Saturday from end of competition until 8:00 pm. Warm up arenas are open for schooling any time.

HOSPITALITY: Light concessions available on grounds.

OTHER: All mounted riders must wear protective headgear as defined in the USEF Rule Book under DR120.6 and in compliance with GR801.

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATON RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

EACH ENTRY MUST include all required documentation. For on line entries follow the instructions. **http://www.eqverification.org/ is** an excellent site to print USEF / USDF card copies for horses, riders and owners all on one page...no photocopying necessary

DIRECTIONS: From Nashville or Chattanooga: I-24 to exit 78B (Highway 96) toward Murfreesboro. At the first traffic light, turn left on Thompsons Lane. Go 5.7 miles to entrance on left. From Franklin: I-65 S. to I-840 E. Get off oat Exit 55A - Murfreesboro, Hwy 41/Hwy 70S. Go 2 miles to Thompsons Lane and turn left. Go 3.8 miles to Miller Colesium on left.

ALL dogs must be leashed, no barking dogs allowed in coliseum.

Adult Regional Team Competition Rules

^Competitors MUST be Adult (A rider may compete in an Adult Team Competition from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22.)

^The USDF Adult Regional Team Competition is a unique show for adults, featuring team competition in dressage, educational programs, team medals and a mounted awards ceremony.

^A team may consist of three or four riders. Mixed level teams are allowed. There are no qualifying scores needed to be on a team. You may enter as part of a team or as an individual and be added to a team. A team may represent a dressage club, farm, barn, instructor, or be a group of individuals. Any individual or partial team needing team members is encouraged to send in their entry and a mixed team will be formed. To enter contact the entry secretary via e-mail or a note on your entry (See important information segment).

^On the day(s) of the Adult Regional Team Competition, the horse or pony, while on the show grounds (including the stabling area), may only be ridden by the adult rider(s) that will be competing that horse or pony. If the team competition is held in conjunction with an open competition, then on the day(s) of the Adult Team Competition the horse or pony may only be ridden by the Adult Rider(s) competing in the team competition.

^All USEF/USDF competition rules apply.

TESTS: Each competitor will ride two tests in their division. Riders competing in FEI divisions may only ride one test. All tests will be current issue.

TEAM NAMES: HAVE FUN!!

AWARDS: USDF rider team neck ribbons will be awarded for first through sixth place in each division. (Divisions will be determined by participation.) Standings will be determined by the average of each team's total score. Any division with more than six teams will be split. USDF Rosettes will be

awarded to the **individual** high score champion and reserve champion in each division. Awards ceremony will be held Saturday evening, an announcement will be made regarding time. *Riders are encouraged to be dressed in riding clothes for the awards ceremony and photo opportunity.*

SCORING: The Lowest score will be dropped if it is a four member team. If only three members on a team than all scores will count. Total score from each of the three team members will be added together and divided by three (3)(an average) to compute team placings. Three and four member teams may be in the same division.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: There will be a team meeting on Friday evening (early), details will be posted. All team competition will take place on Saturday. There is no fee to compete on a team. In addition to your normal entry form, please submit a note indicating your intention to be on a team specifying the classes to include in team competition. Include (if you can) team name and names of other team members. If you want to be assigned to a team please indicate. We encourage all eligible competitors to join a team and join in the fun. If you need additional members to fill out your team we will arrange as possible. Team competition forms will be finalized at the Friday meeting. Scores will be posted in the secretary's office. Please check them early and often to see how your team progresses!

Additional Information: All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2018

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)
Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or
 dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions
 (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also
 exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are
 open to all breeds.
- By calling or writing the USDF office at (859) 971-2277, 4051 Iron Works Parkway, Lexington, KY 40511

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.





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USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
