High Score FEI for each Division (AA. Open, Jr/YR.) (Does not include Freestyle, YH or Opportunity at any Level or division.) Check www.tndressage.com for final list. Be sure to enclose your registry papers with your entry.

National Dressage Pony Cup Awards sponsored by **Flint Ridge Farm** will be presented for scores earned in Saturday class #281. **PONY MEASUREMENT:** Measurement of ponies will be conducted by appointment at the show. All expenses related to the measurement will be the responsibility of the owner of the pony or ponies up to \$100.00. Contact the Show Manager if you want to arrange to have a pony

measured. *Only measured ponies may participate in Pony Classes.* Expenses may include vet travel time and trip fees, and any other expenses not normally associated with a dressage show.

The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) is offering ribbons and prizes to the high score (including a FEI high point) **Thoroughbred** at the CLASSIC show (Saturday Classes). Eligible horses must provide T.I.P. numbers to event organizer with entry. For more information, visit www.tjctip.com

ENTRIES: *Freestyle entries must be accompanied by a photocopy of test verifying eligibility (minimum requirement 60% at the highest test of a declared level from an USEF show or any test of a higher level). Freestyle music must be given to the announcer at least four hours before the scheduled ride time. Coordinate a sound check time with the announcer. Juniors please list your birth date. State "qualifying" where applicable. GAIG/USDF qualifying entries must include copy of APPROPRIATE USEF and USDF horse registration cards. State level on Test of Choice classes. Riders who are not US citizens please include a copy of foreign competitors license or USEF Card. **Each Entry** must have copies of All Required Documentation attached (USDF/USEF membership, a legible negative Coggins Name of horse matching entry or 30 Day Health Certificate, **If your horse is from out of state Health Cert. is required**). Include LEGIBLE e-mail address and phone number on entry. **Acknowledgements of entry receipt and notification of problems with the entry will be emailed to the address that you provide. PLEASE READ AND RESPOND!***

ENTRY DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-QUALIFYING RIDES:

- Current USEF membership (or n/m fees) for Rider, Owner and Trainer, Coach
- Current USDF membership (or n/m fees, number) for Rider and Owner. **Rider's USDF membership may be either Participating or Group, Owner's USDF membership may be Participating, Group or Business; if Rider/Owner's USDF # is a non-member ID #, the USDF non-member fee must be paid.**
- USDF Horse ID.
- Current negative Coggins and proof of vaccinations as per Rule GR845 or 30 day health certificate. (Current FEI Passport acceptable).
- For Adult Amateur classes - USEF membership card must declare Amateur.
- Juniors and Young Riders must include birthdate.
- Freestyle entries - copy of a 60% + at the highest test of the MFS level or higher.

FOR GAIG / USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES ALSO INCLUDE:

- Check "Qualifying" and add \$10 per Qualifying class.
- Copies of USEF and USDF Horse Registrations (not HID #s).
- Rider must have current Participating USDF membership; Owner must have current Participating or Business USDF membership.
- Rider and Owner, must have current USEF membership.

ALL ENTRIES must have **THREE SIGNATURES** - Rider, Owner and Trainer Legal Guardian must sign for riders under 18 yrs. Trainer blank must be signed by person over 18 who assumes responsibility for horse. (Parents who sign as trainer are exempt from membership requirements).

GUEST HORSE: Non Competing horses are welcome. Send a completed entry form with a \$25 user fee plus the \$25 Office fee. Submit a current Coggins with entry and pay either stabling or day parking. Competing horses will take preference over guests if warm up areas are crowded.

Make check payable to CTDA and mail with entry, USDF/USEF documents and copy of negative Coggins to Secretary. Entries must be received by the closing date. (*Waive signature requirements for receipt*). Entries received after closing date will be placed on a waiting list. Returned check policy: Void entry and incur a \$25 charge. Entries placed on a waiting list until a money order, certified check or cash is received.

ON LINE ENTRIES: www.EquestrianEntries.com is the website for online entries to this show. It is also the source for legible, "mistake proof" typed entries even if you do not choose to pay by credit card through them. Fees for online entries are 5% of entry. Or you can print the information and send with a check to the show secretary.

Coggins and Proof of Vaccination Requirements USEF Rule *GR845

As of December 1, 2015 every competitor entering the show grounds must carry with them, and be prepared to show on demand, proof of vaccination for EHV-1 and Equine Influenza within the past 6 months, and proof of a negative Coggins test within the past 12 months, from the date the show opens. Anyone unable to provide such documentation may be asked to leave the show grounds within one hour. Coggins must be legible, show the date and the negative result, and be in the name of the horse as it is entered on your entry.

***GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule**

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino- pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this

rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15.

Acceptable Health Documentation may include one of the following:

- 1.) *30 Day Health Certificate with date of Coggins and date of vaccination included. (with entry) This would be the preferred documentation by the show office.*
- 2.) Separate Coggins (with entry) **and** Proof of vaccination (to be shown if asked).
- 3.) Separate Coggins (with entry) **and** Letter from veterinarian on their letterhead stating date of vaccination (to be shown if asked).

All documentation must be legible and clearly state the name of the horse as entered in the show.

Refunds: Before closing date full refund, less office fee. No refunds after closing date, including cancellation of classes due to inclement weather.

Tennessee law requires the original negative Coggins (drawn within 12 months of the show) be presented to the show secretary when picking up competition packets.

EACH ENTRY MUST include all required documentation. For on line entries follow the instructions. <http://www.eqverification.org/> is an excellent site to print USEF / USDF card copies for horses, riders and owners all on one page...no photocopying necessary.

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STABLING: If you are coming to both parts of the show please note on both entry forms, but pay on **“CLASSIC”** Entry Form. Permanent 10 X 10 stalls, with sliding doors. . Barns have wash racks, modern bathrooms/showers, vending areas. Pre Order extra shavings to have them available for your arrival. **For Groups: Specify ONE name to coordinate the group.**

TIMES: Official times available Thursday, noon at show office. Unofficial times posted Monday night before show at www.TNDressage.com. Entry acknowledgements will be emailed. Please include LEGIBLE email addresses and telephone number on entry form.

ACCOMODATIONS Days Inn, Clarion Inn, Doubletree Inn, Hampton, etc.

DIRECTIONS: **From Nashville or Chattanooga:** I-24 to exit 78B (Highway 96) toward Murfreesboro. At the first traffic light, turn left on Thompsons Lane. Go 5.7 miles to entrance on left. **From Franklin:** I-65 S. to I-840 E. Get off at Exit 55A - Murfreesboro, Hwy 41/Hwy 70S. Go 2 miles to Thompsons Lane and turn left. Go 3.8 miles to Miller Col on left.

ARENAS: Air conditioned Indoor arena. Competition: 20 X 60 meters, two indoor, (side by side). Warm-up: One covered one outdoor, separate area for lunging. All outdoor rings are sand/quarter down mix. Indoor rings are clay/sand mix with coliseum seating. All arenas are open for schooling from Thursday noon until 8:00 pm. On Friday and Saturday from end of competition until 8:00 pm. Warm up arenas are open for schooling any time.

HOSPITALITY: Concessions available on grounds.

OTHER. All mounted riders must wear protective headgear as defined in the USEF Rule Book under DR120.6 and in compliance with GR801.

Entries accepted on a first come, first served basis. Management reserves the right to combine or divide classes, add or substitute judges or make any changes as required by circumstances.

All dogs must be leashed, no dogs allowed in coliseum.

Youth Regional Team Competition Rules

- A Rider may compete as a Junior/Young Rider until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.

- The USDF Youth Regional Team Competition is a unique show for Youth, featuring team competition in dressage, educational programs, team medals and mounted awards ceremony. The United States Dressage Federation (USDF) is sponsoring a competition in each region so young riders everywhere can join in the fun!
- There are no qualifying scores needed to enter. A team can be 3 or 4 riders. You may enter as part of a team or as an individual, and be put on a scratch team. A team may represent a dressage club, farm, barn, instructor, Pony Club, 4-H club, any youth riding club, or be a group of individuals. Any individual or partial team needing team members is encouraged to send in their entry and a mixed team will be formed. To enter, send in the Team Competition Entry Blank. See www.tndressage.com or contact the secretary for a form...or fill one out at check in at the show.

RULES: On the day of the Youth Regional Team competition while on the grounds (including the stabling area) the horse or pony may only be ridden by the Youth Rider that will be competing on that horse or pony. If the Team Competition is held in conjunction with an open competition, then on the day of the Youth Team Competition the horse or pony may only be ridden by the Youth Rider competing in the team competition.

- One whip is allowed and must be in accordance with the USEF whip rules.
- Horses and ponies are to be braided
- Parents are encouraged to participate.
- Awards Ceremony: Riders will be expected to be dressed in riding clothes and mounted for the awards ceremony.

TESTS: Each competitor will ride two tests in their division. Riders competing in FEI divisions will only ride one test. All tests used will be current issue.

TEAM NAMES : Have fun with this! Some examples are: Pony Power; Wild Things...

AWARDS: USDF rider team medals on neck ribbons will be awarded for first through sixth place in each division. Standings will be determined by the average of each team's total score. Any division with more than six teams will be split. USDF Rosettes will be awarded to the Individual High Score Champion and Reserve in each division. Riders will be expected to be dressed in riding clothes and mounted for the awards ceremony. USDF Shining Star pins will be awarded to recognize outstanding sportsmanship amongst USDF Youth Members (see USDF Shining Star Award nomination form for further details).

SCORING: All scores from each team will be counted. No scores will be dropped. Total points from each team member will be added and averaged for team score. Three and four member teams may be in the same division.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: There will be a team meeting on Friday evening (early) Details will be posted. All team competition will all take place on Saturday, There is no fee to compete on a team. In addition to your normal entry form, please submit a note indicating your intention to be on a team specifying the classes to include in team competition. Include team name and names of other members. If you want to be assigned to a team please indicate. We encourage all eligible competitors to join a team and join in the fun. If you need additional members to fill out your team we will arrange it as possible. Team Competition forms will be finalized at the Friday Meeting. Scores will posted in the secretary's office. Please check them early and often to see how your team progresses!

MOUNTED AWARDS ceremony will be held Saturday evening.

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GOLF CARTS AND ANY MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: All golf carts and motorized vehicles on the show grounds must be driven only by those having a valid state driver's license. All liability associated with any motorized vehicles is owned by the motorized vehicle driver, owner and lessee. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside, will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of ANY kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against of the above in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. USEF Article GR901.29.

ENTRY FORMS: Entry forms are available on www.eqentries.com or www.TNdressage.com or on the last pages of this document.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule:

1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify

any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

Federation Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of **Ole South Prelude and Ole South Classic** (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse

Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from

the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or life (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

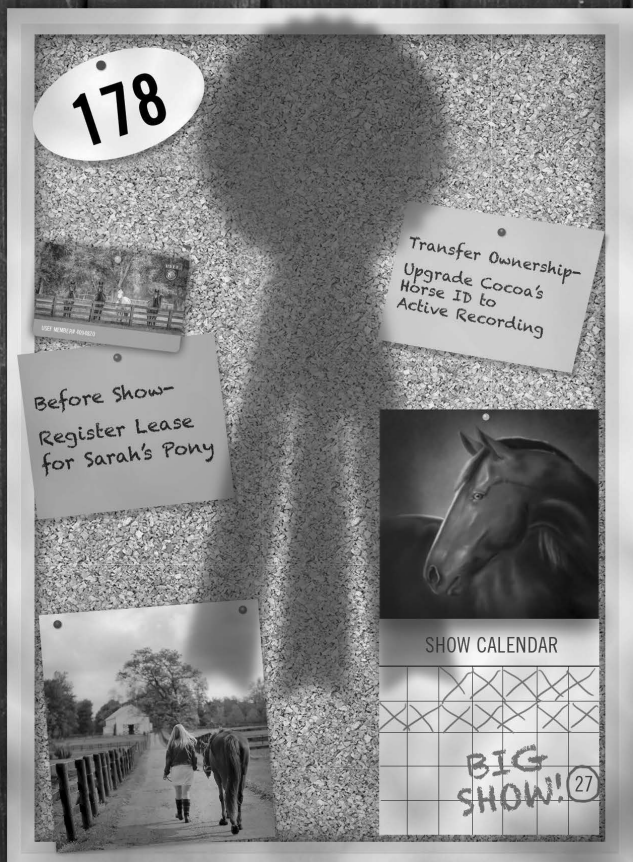
